Initially the Chairperson welcomed all the members and the following measures were discussed.

Item No.1 Distribution of SC/ST Scholarships to the deserving students

For the academic year 2021-2022, scholarship was applied and Rs.4,44,684/- was claimed through Government SC/ST Scholarship. UGC Post Graduate Indira Gandhi Single Girl Child Scholarship was applied for 12 students.

Rs.17,30,000/- was received under Central Sector Scholarship Scheme (CSSS) for 173 students. Minority scholarship has been applied for 50 students and Rs.3,00,000/- was claimed. Redigition scholarship applied for 14 students and 91,000/- was received.

Item No.2 Review of Renewal of Scholarship.

Renewal of SC/ST scholarship for 160 students were intimated through circular and class in-charges and received Rs. 10,15,040/-. For 20 students, renewal of UGC Post Graduate Indira Gandhi Single Girl Child Scholarship was initiated and a sum of Rs.7,24,000/- is claimed. Renewal of CSSS is applied for 54 students and Rs.5,30,000/- was claimed. Minority scholarship has been renewed for 33 students and Rs.2,04,000/- was claimed. One SC/ST Ph.D student applied for scholarship and received Rs.50,000/-.

Item No.3 Review of Special Schemes of Scholarship by Management

Our management has magnanimously contributed 50% of the college fees of Rs.11,38,500/- for 50 poor and needy UG & PG students, out of which 50 are I UG students, 39 are II UG students, 46 are from III year UG students. 10 Students from I PG and 05 students from II PG are benefitted through the management scholarship.

Item No.4 Review of Adequacy of Infrastructure Facilities

To handle classes interactively and effectively, in addition to 48 LCD projectors, 32 LCD projectors are added.

Item No.5 Review of Career Guidance and Placement Cell

Career Guidance and Placement Cell has organized many training programme through the MOUs with leading companies. 150 students are benefitted by free Certificate Programme in Banking, Finance and Insurance(CPBFI), through Bajaj Finserv Ltd., & Bajaj Finance Ltd., Pune, all the UG and PG final years are undergone the training on "Life Skills" and 55 students are given training on "Medical coding" through EIT, Madurai.

Also the cell creates the opportunities for the students to take part in various campus interviews in IT(Accenture, WIPRO, TCS, Athenatec) and Non-IT sectors (First Source, Capgemini, Omega, Spiro, Straive and WICE) to place in suitable jobs. Totally 115 students got placement in reputed companies.

Item No.6 Review of Remedial action through Counseling Cell

Importance of education was highlighted through reality approach to minimize the absenteeism. Digital detoxification method was followed to control behavior of the students who were addicted to mobile phone. Students had changes in their attitude in this transformation phase, Behavioural Approach & Solution focused approach was applied to those students to bring changes in their attitude & behavior.

Item No.7 Review of Fee Payment through online

Students are encouraged to pay their fees online during this pandemic and it reduces their waiting time for the fee payment. 400 students were paid through bill desk and HDFC bank.

Item No.8 Review of Student Group Insurance

The annual premium of Rs.25 per year per student is collected compulsorily by clubbing it with other fees for the Student Group Insurance as per the instruction given by the Bharathidasan University. Student Group Insurance was paid for 3416 students of UG, 567 students of PG and 3 students of Ph.D for the academic year 2021-2022.

Item No.9 Review of Student Incubation Centre

Dhaarani, Student Alumni, Commerce is approved with PMEGP loan of Rs.2,00,000 to start an alumni campus company of Herbal Sanitary Napkin unit inside the campus. EDC jointly with We Raise Foundation, MSME chamber of commerce and Industry awarded to 2 alumni's and 1 student from I PG Mathematics.

Totally Rs.14,472/- was earned by the students from various departments through Parlour. 4 alumni's are given opportunity to take value added course for the students.

Internships:

Two alumni students are selected as interns in Digital Marketing by MIT Square, London from 03.03.2022. Three students from SIC Bakes assisted in providing Baking Internship for 10 school students from Annai Lea Higher Secondary School, Sevapur.

Item No.10 Review of Department Association Club

Department association clubs conducted various Conferences, Seminars, Workshops and Quizzes on their own domain specific topics to inculcate knowledge and also to motivate the students to take part in various competitions.

Item No.11 Review of Cauvery Fitness Centre

The Cauvery Fitness Centre is utilized by 84 hostel and day scholar students regularly during 6.00am to 8.00 am and 3.00pm to 6.00pm. The students are allowed to access the gym in their allotted timings to practice a healthy lifestyle.

Item No.12 Review of SWAYAM online Courses

Students are encouraged to enroll in the NPTEL online courses during Jan – April 2022, nearly 1400 were registered. Free transport facility provided to the students to attend the NPTEL exam. Fee waivers are applied for 285 students who cleared the NPTEL exams during June – Oct 2021.

Item no.13 Review of Merit cum Means Scholarship

Under Merit cum Means Scholarship 30 poor and needy students with good marks of I UG were identified and fee concession of Rs.1,50,000/- was given for the semester fees. Through CASA Rs.4,20,000/- was given for 84 students to pay their semester fees. Through Palanisamy Pillai Trust 3 students got benefitted with Rs.25,075/-. Topper of II year UG student is selected and recognized with Rs.3000/- in her II year as well as in III year by Sulthan Chand Dropadi Devi Education Memorial Scholarship.

Item no.14 Financial Assistance given by Management

- Students who excel in academic as well as in extra-curricular from each department is selected and recognized with cash of Rs.1,500/- for 4 students through Rajagopal award and Rs.1,000/- through Thiripura Sundari award for 12 students.
- During convocation, Overall Topper from UG Arts and UG Science students are awarded with cash prize of Rs. 10,000/- with plaque through “PURUSHOTHAMA REDDIAR” and “SHANTHI VIJAYARAGHAVAN” scholastic merit respectively.
- 8 University I Rank Holders are appreciated with Rs.1000/- and 77 other Rank Holders are recognized with Rs.500/-
- Our college management has refunded the amount of Rs. 45,000/- to the 90 Bajaj Trainee (Rs.500/- each) those who cleared the assessment and received training certificate.
- To recognize and appreciate the meritorious students and to motivate online learning, our management has magnanimously reimbursed the exam fees of Rs.1,000/- to the students qualified with Toppers, Elite+Gold and Elite+Silver grade. Totally Rs.48,000/- were refunded by our management
- Students involved in maintaining the discipline inside the college campus were given Rs. 1000/- as a token of appreciation for 42 members.
- Fees was paid by the management for a semester, to appreciate Ms.T.Malini of I M.Sc Maths, for the participation in All India ball badminton tournament
