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Initially the Chairperson welcomed all the members and the following measures were discussed.

Item No.1 Distribution of SC/ST Scholarships to the deserving students

Government SC/ST Scholarship for 66 students are applied for the students admitted in the academic year 2022-2023.

For 13 students, UGC Post Graduate Indira Gandhi Single Girl Child Scholarship was applied and Rs.4,34,400/- was claimed. Central Sector Scholarship Scheme (CSSS) was applied for 79 students and Rs.9,48,000/- was claimed. Govt. Minority Scholarship of Rs.2,34,000/- has been claimed for 39 students. Redington scholarship is applied for 10 students for the total sum of Rs.1,00,000/-. Government Moovalur Scholarship is approved for 195 II and III year students and received Rs.1000/- for each student. For the 116 first year students, Moovalur Scholarship is applied.

Item No.2 Review of Renewal of Scholarship

Renewal of SC/ST scholarship for 108 students were intimated through circular and class in-charges. Renewal of Central Sector Scholarship Scheme (CSSS) is done for 156 students and Rs.19,22,000/- was claimed. For 33 students Minority Scholarship has been renewed and Rs.1,98,000/- was claimed. Redington scholarship is also renewed for 11 students and Rs.1,10,000/- was claimed. One SC/ST Ph.D student received Rs.50,000/- as scholarship.

Item No.3 Review of Special Schemes of Scholarship by Management

Our management has magnanimously contributed the college fees of Rs.1,23,750/- for 15 poor and needy students of I and II PG students. 128 Students from I year, II year and III year UG are benefitted through the management scholarship of Rs. 10,19,150/-

Item No.4 Review of Career Guidance and Placement Cell

TRAINING:

1. As part of MOU with Bajaj Finserv Ltd., and Bajaj Finance Ltd., Pune, the Career Guidance and placement Cell organized training programme on “**Certificate Programme on Banking Finance and Insurance**” – CPBFI for 100 hrs from 30/11/2022 to 22/12/2022 in offline mode to make the graduates employable for the banking, Financial Services and Insurance sector. 94 students were participated and 56 got certified.
2. The Cell in alliance with Global Talent Track Training (GTT), organized a training on “**LIFE SKILLS**” during 19/12/2022 – 21/12/2022 and 10/01/2023 – 12/01/2023. The training was attended by 749, final year students from all departments.
3. A Training programme was organized on 4th and 5th January 2023 to give the exposure to learn Interview techniques by Mr. Kapilan Ramarajan, Founder & CEO, Kapilan Institute of Training, Trichy. This training was extended to the economically weaker background students irrespective of the departments. Totally 53 students have undergone the training and got benefitted.
4. Motivational session for UPSC/TNPSC aspirants on 9th January 2023, in alliance with Hindu Tamil Newspaper was and Mr. S. Sivarajavel, Director, Sivarajavel IAS Academy was the

chief guest, presented many preparation tips to succeed in UPSC/TNPSC examinations. 354 students have participated and benefitted.

5. A training program on “Fundamentals of Medical Coding” is organized with EIT, during 30th January 2023 to 11th March 2023 (60 hours) through Google Meet platform. The training was attended by final year students from the Life Science Departments with a counting of 95 students.

RECRUITMENT DETAILS.

For the academic year 2022 – 2023, the students have been given the chances to attend different on-line interviews. Totally 387 students are placed in

- **IT and Non-IT companies** inclusive of TCS, Capgemini, Vee Technologies, IDFC Bank, GTT, VDART, WICE, RANE, CAPGEMINI
- **Educational Institutions** like Big Temple International School, Kamala Niketan School – KNMS and VIJAY Group of Institutions

Item No.5 Review of Counselling Cell

Counseling Cell of Department of Social Work continually addresses the problems of students who seek professional assistance. The problems encountered by the students are deviant behaviors, lack of attention during class, conflict with classmates, deviated and became addicted to social media and lost the practice of reading, memorizing & attending tests and lack of interest in their studies. Reality oriented session were given to bring them back to study. To rectify this Parent-Teachers meeting was organized, continuous follow up was done.

Item No.6 Review of Student Group Insurance

The annual premium of Rs.25/- per year per student is collected compulsorily by clubbing it with other fees for the Student Group Insurance for 3,628 students as per the instruction given by the Bharathidasan University.

Item No.7 Review of Student Incubation Centre

E Cell has established Student Incubation Center (SIC) with a motto to create an entrepreneurial eco - system during their graduation period. 27 students are monitoring the campus companies incorporated under SIC.

Total amount of Rs.19,809/- have been earned by 16 students from B.Com, B.Com CA and Maths by utilizing the SIC bakes incubation facility, parlour service, bouquet making, printing services and coordinating Value Added Courses.

Three alumni's are given opportunity to take value added course for the students and earned Rs.21,500/-. Ms.Tulsi, (II B.com) has earned Rs.4,500/- in training the students in Silk thread Jewellery and Ms.Kirthuika (III B.Sc Maths) earned Rs.2,250/- in mentoring the Arduino coding value added course offered by EDC.

Our IIC students (5 teams) has got selected in final grand Nationwide Hackathon challenge organized by EDII, Ahmedabad on 28.04.2023 and 29.04.2023. In this regard, a sum of Rs.1,18,139/- has been sanctioned by our college management for supporting student's startup.

Item No.8 Review of Department Association Club

Department association clubs conducted various Conferences, Seminars, Workshops and Quizzes on their own domain specific topics to inculcate knowledge and also to motivate the students to take part in various competitions. Also, various extension activities are organized to inculcate the social responsibility to the students and the students were took part actively.

Item No.10 Review of Rotaract Club

Rockcity Welfare Association (RWA) has issued free books for 3 students.

Item No.11 Review of Leo Club

Lions Club of Tiruchirappalli Rock city have sponsored Rs 17,000/- to Leo club of Cauvery College for Women. Faculty members of Cauvery College also provided Rs.16,000/-. This amount is utilized to provide noon meal to the economically weaker students. Under noon meal scheme 13 deserving students from all the department were selected and having their noon meal at hostel.

Item No.12 Review of SWAYAM online Courses

Students are encouraged to enroll in the NPTEL online courses every semester and free transport facility is provided to the students to attend the NPTEL exam. Fee waivers are applied for 61 students who cleared the NPTEL exams during July – October 2022. Online Soft Skills training was conducted for the students through NPTEL. 30 students from various departments have participated and got benefited.

Item no.13 Review of Merit cum Means Scholarship

Under Merit cum Means Scholarship, 59 students of I UG and II UG poor and needy students with good marks were identified and fee concession of Rs.4,25,000/- was given for the semester fees. From Prof. Srinivasan Trust, Rs. 45,000/- were received and two poor and needy students' semester fee was paid. Palanisamy Pillai Trust Rs. 26,100/- has paid towards term fees for 3 UG students. Through the Cauvery College Alumni Association (CCAA), 114 students of I, II- and III-year students of UG were paid 50% of the term fees of Rs.5,70,000/-.

Through alumni students of 1994-1996 batch, the total amount of Rs.1,03,570/- are received and given to 12 students from various department as a term fee.

Item no.14 Financial Assistance given by Management

- Students who excel in academic as well as in extra-curricular from each department is selected and recognized with cash award of Rs.1,000/- for 20 students through Rajagopal award and Thiripura Sundari award.
- During convocation, Overall Topper from UG Arts and UG Science students are awarded with cash prize of Rs. 10,000/- with plaque through "PURUSHOTHAMA REDDIAR" and "SHANTHI VIJAYARAGHAVAN" scholastic merit respectively.
- Through Na.Subbu Reddiar Trust, each Rs.5,000/- is given to the Topper students of Arts, Science and Commerce.
- Under Sultan Chand Scholarship Rs.1,00,000/- were deposited. Interest is utilized for the commerce students
- Thiru. Thiruneelakandan, Secretary has deposited Rs.5,00,000/- and the interest amount Rs.5000/- is provided to a B.Com student.
- Our management has returned the training fee of Rs.28,000/- to 56 students those who certified by Bajaj Finserv Ltd., Pune.
- Our management has provided a total sum of Rs.40,000/- for 40 students (each Rs.1000/-) of discipline committee to recognize their contribution in maintaining the discipline and decorum of our college.
- To recognize and appreciate the meritorious students and to motivate online learning through SWAYAM-NPTEL, our management has magnanimously reimbursed the exam fees of Rs.41,000/- to the 39 students those who qualified with Toppers, Elite+Gold and Elite+Silver grade.
