Initially the Chairperson welcomed all the members and the following measures were discussed.

# Item No.1 Distribution of SC/ST Scholarships to the deserving students

Government SC/ST Scholarship are applied for the 75 students admitted in the academic year 2023-2024.

For 7 students, UGC Post Graduate Indira Gandhi Single Girl Child Scholarship was applied and Rs.2,53,400/- was claimed. Central Sector Scholarship Scheme (CSSS) was applied for 98 students and Rs.11,76,000/- was claimed. For the 138 first year students, Moovalur Scholarship is applied and received 16,56,000/-

#### Item No.2 Review of Renewal of Scholarship

Renewal of SC/ST scholarship for 99 students were intimated through circular and class in-charges. Renewal of Central Sector Scholarship Scheme (CSSS) is done for 177 students and Rs.33,00,000/- was claimed. One SC/ST Ph.D student received Rs.1,00,000/- as scholarship.Moovalur Ramamirtham Ammaiyar Scholarship is received for 184 II and III UG students and received Rs.22,08,000/-.

#### Item No.3 Review of Special Schemes of Scholarship by Management

Our management has magnanimously contributed the 50% of the semester fees of Rs. 20,66,000/- to the 144 poor and needy students of UG and PG.

#### Item No.4 Review of Career Guidance and Placement Cell

- 1. GTT's "LIFE SKILLS" Training was given to 1020 Students
- 2. Workshop on "LinkedIn Career Kickstarter" were conducted to 1898 of final years and pre-final year students.
- 3. Awareness on Government Jobs & Opportunities were organized through Employment Office to 140 students
- 4. Mock Interview Session was conducted by Hallmark Business School to 105 students
- 5. With EIT, 32 students were given training on "Fundamentals of Medical Coding"
- 6. Corporate Sustainability Session for 180 BCOM students were organized

#### RECRUITMENT DETAILS

For the academic year 2023 - 2024, the students have been given the chances to attend different on-line interviews. Totally **280** of our students are placed in

- IT and Non-IT companies inclusive of TCS, WIPRO, Accenture, Deloitte, Capgemini, WICE, Michael's Academy and Omega
- Educational Institutions like Big Temple International School, Kamala Niketan School KNMS, VIJAY Group of Institutions, SFT School, Raj Vidhya Bhavan.

### Item No.5 Review of Counselling Cell

Counseling Cell of Department of Social Work continually addresses the problems of students who seek professional assistance. The problems of students encountered was improper usage of Gadgets, deviation

and lack of interest led to absenteeism, love failure, issues from their broken family, lack of parental care and intolerance of academic failures. Reality therapy was applied to the students to come out of their problems and also contacted parents of few students and offered tele counselling. 10 cases were received this academic year and the problems were redressed between 1 to 3 sessions.

### Item No.6 Review of Student Group Insurance

The annual premium of Rs.25/- per year per student is collected compulsorily by clubbing it with other fees for the Student Group Insurance for 3,272 students as per the instruction given by the Bharathidasan University.

#### Item No.7 Review of Student Incubation Centre

Entrepreneurship Development Cell has organized nearly 190 seminars/workshops to inculcate innovative ideas and knowledge among the students.

16 innovators registered their startups in MSME, Government of India with license. Out of 16, 8 starteups have been launched for commercial market. 35 innovative ideas have been submitted by IIC students in Smart India Hackathon'23 organized by Ministry of Education, Government of India.

Ms. M. Sowmiya was nominated as Entrepreneurship Ambassador in GUESS India

Ms. Sowmiya and team got first place in millet awareness competition. Ms. Yogalakshmi and Ms. S. Archana received Best Innovation Award in Startup Mela 6.0 with the cash prize of Rs.20,000/-. Ms.Sowmiya, Ms.Anukarthika and Ms.Afsana, Ms.Fazheela got First, Second and Third prize in Cauvery Youth Festival with cash prize of Rs.5,000/-, Rs.4,000/- and Rs.3000/- respectively.

IIC nominated 10 innovative students are undergoing Innovation Ambassador training in National Innovation Repository. IIC students have been incubated at Anna Business Incubation Forum and Trichy Agri business Incubation Forum.

Ms. Bindhiya and team, Department of Commerce provoked a project on Women Safety Gadget with the support of management with Rs.15,000/-. Ms. Vanisha and team received Rs.15,000/- as seed fund from the management for the development of prototype on I-Teller communication device inside the campus

A sum of Rs.59,330/- were generated by the students through value added courses and Innovative Campus Bazzar.

# Item No.8 Review of Department Association Club

Department association clubs conducted various Conferences, Seminars, Workshops and Quizzes on their own domain specific topics to inculcate knowledge and also to motivate the students to take part in various competitions. Additionally, they arranged diverse extension activities aimed at instilling a sense of social responsibility in students, who actively engaged in these initiatives. Students enthusiastically engage in

student clubs and organizations, actively volunteering for community service projects and pursuing internships and research opportunities.

#### Item No.9 Review of Sports

Sports students are encouraged to participate in all the state and national level competitions. To maintain the stamina, health drinks. eggs and spouts are given to the students.

#### Item No.10 Review of Rotaract Club

Rotory Club of Tiruchirappalli midtown has contributed Rs.18,620/- for paying the semester fee for 1 student. Rockcity Welfare Association (RWA) has issued free books for 39 students through book bank scheme.

#### Item No.11 Review of Leo Club

Lions Club of Tiruchirappalli Rock city have sponsored Rs 17,350/- to as semester fee for 1 student. Rs.10,000/- were given for noon meal scheme and the deserving students from the departments were selected and having their noon meal at hostel.

#### Item No.12 Review of SWAYAM online Courses

Students are encouraged to enroll in the NPTEL online courses every semester and free transport facility is provided to the students to attend the NPTEL exam. Fee waivers are applied for 145 students who cleared the NPTEL exams and received Rs.500/- for each student totally Rs.72,500/- from NPTEL for the Jan-April and June-Oct 2023 semesters.

#### Item No.13 Review of Merit cum Means Scholarship

Under Merit cum Means Scholarship, 79 students of UG students with good marks were identified and fee concession of Rs.6,50,000/- was given for the semester fees. Through the Cauvery College Alumna Association (CCAA), 105 students of I, II- and III-year students of UG were paid 50% of the term fees of Rs.5,25,000/-.

Through alumni students of 1993-1996 batch, the total amount of Rs.1,34,025/- are received and given to 8 students from various department as a term fee.

### Item No.14 Financial Assistance given by Management

- Under Sultan Chand Scholarship Rs.1,00,000/- were deposited. Interest is utilized for the commerce students
- Thiru. Thiruneelakandan, Secretary has deposited Rs.5,00,000/- and the interest amount Rs.5000/- is provided to a B. Com student.
- Several other endowments award worth Rs.2,03,000/- also utilized for the semester fees as well as awards.
- Our management has returned the training fee of Rs.36,500/- to 73 students those who certified by Bajaj Finserv Ltd., Pune.

# Item No.15 Financial Assistance for Semester fees given by others

- From Prof. Srinivasan Trust, Rs. 1,90,000/- were received and 13 student's semester fee was paid.
- Palanisamy Pillai Trust has donated Rs. 5,500/- it was paid towards the term fees for 1 UG student.
- 5 students from various departments got benefitted from Rs. 27,000/- given by Dr. Prema Joshua
- Ms. Nikitha, student of Food Service Management & Dietetics has contributed Rs.21,500/- and utilized for the semester fees of the needy student
- Two toppers from Department of Commerce received Rs.6000/- from Sultan Chand Droupati Devi Memorial Scholarship
- Mr. G. Muthukrishnan, College President has paid the semester fees of Rs.44,900/- to 5 students.
- Aid Indian Trust contributed Rs.10,000/- and 1 student was benefitted.
- Anandham Youth Foundation Trust has given Rs.1,06,057/- and it was utilized for 6 students' semester fees.
- Deepse Trust, Dr. Vivek Sundaram Hospital, Iman Educational and Charitable Trust, Mother Superior Holy Cross Convent, Thandalai J Chidambara Reddiar Trust, Viruksha trust, Windia Chemicals Private Limited and Aid India Trust are other prominent trust who have contributed totally Rs.1,79,975/- and 18 students were benefitted.

## Item No.16 Recognizing the Rank Holders and Outstanding Students

On Graduation Day, our management allocated Rs. 65,000/- for cash awards for students from the 2021, 2022, and 2023 batches. Additionally, Rs. 43,500/- was spent on gold medals for all three batches.

- Students who excel in academic as well as in extra-curricular from each department is selected and recognized with cash award of Rs.1,000/- each for 22 students through Rajagopal award and Thiripura Sundari award.
- During convocation, the Overall Topper from UG Arts and UG Science students are awarded a
  cash prize of Rs. 60,000/- with plaque through "PURUSHOTHAMA REDDIAR" and
  "SHANTHI VIJAYARAGHAVAN" scholastic merit awards, respectively, for the 2021, 2022
  and 2023 batch students..
- Through Na. Subbu Reddiar Trust, each Rs.5,000/- is given to the top students of Arts, Science and Commerce totaling Rs.15,000/-

- As a token of appreciation, Rs.30,000/- (2,500/- each) were given to 12 students those who excel in academic as well as extra-curricular activities by Mr. Thiruneelakandan, Secretary, Cauvery College for Women, Trichy.
- A total sum of Rs.40,000/- for 40 students (each Rs.1000/-) of discipline committee to recognize
  their contribution in maintaining the discipline and decorum of our college. Also, health drink,
  eggs and sprouts are provided to enhance stamina.
- To appreciate meritorious students and to motivate online learning through SWAYAM-NPTEL, our management reimbursed the exam fees of Rs.76,500/- to 105 students for the Jan-May 2023 and June-Oct 2023 periods, who qualified with Toppers, Elite+Gold and Elite+Silver grade.
