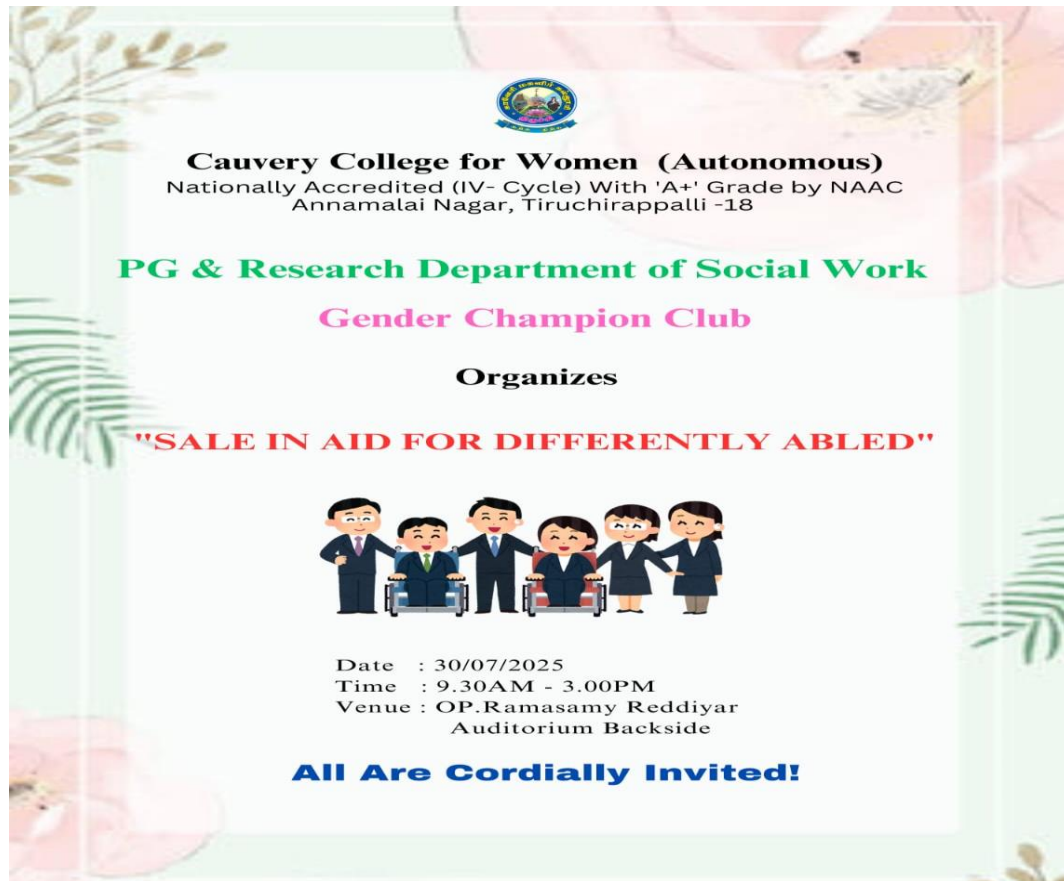

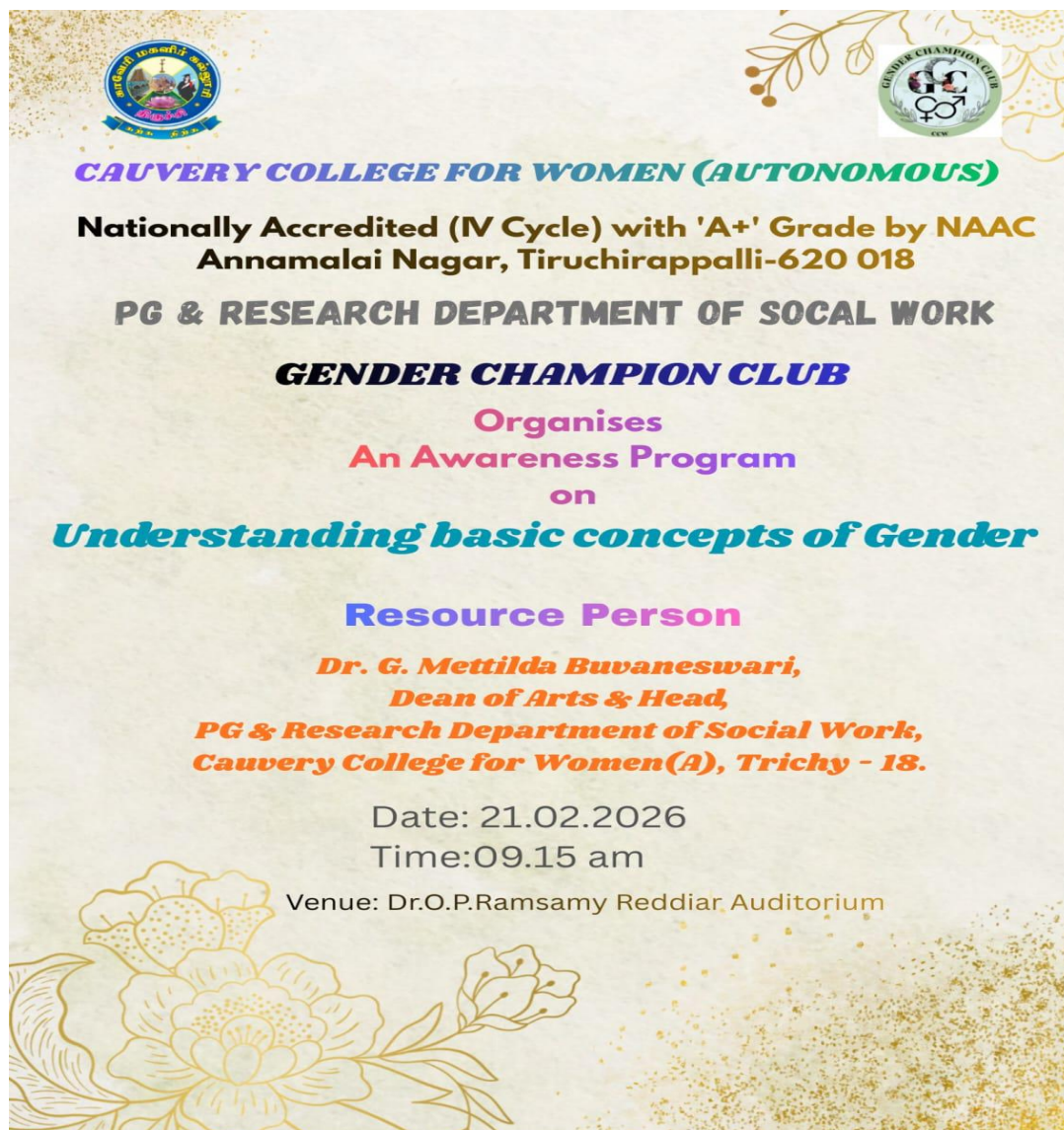

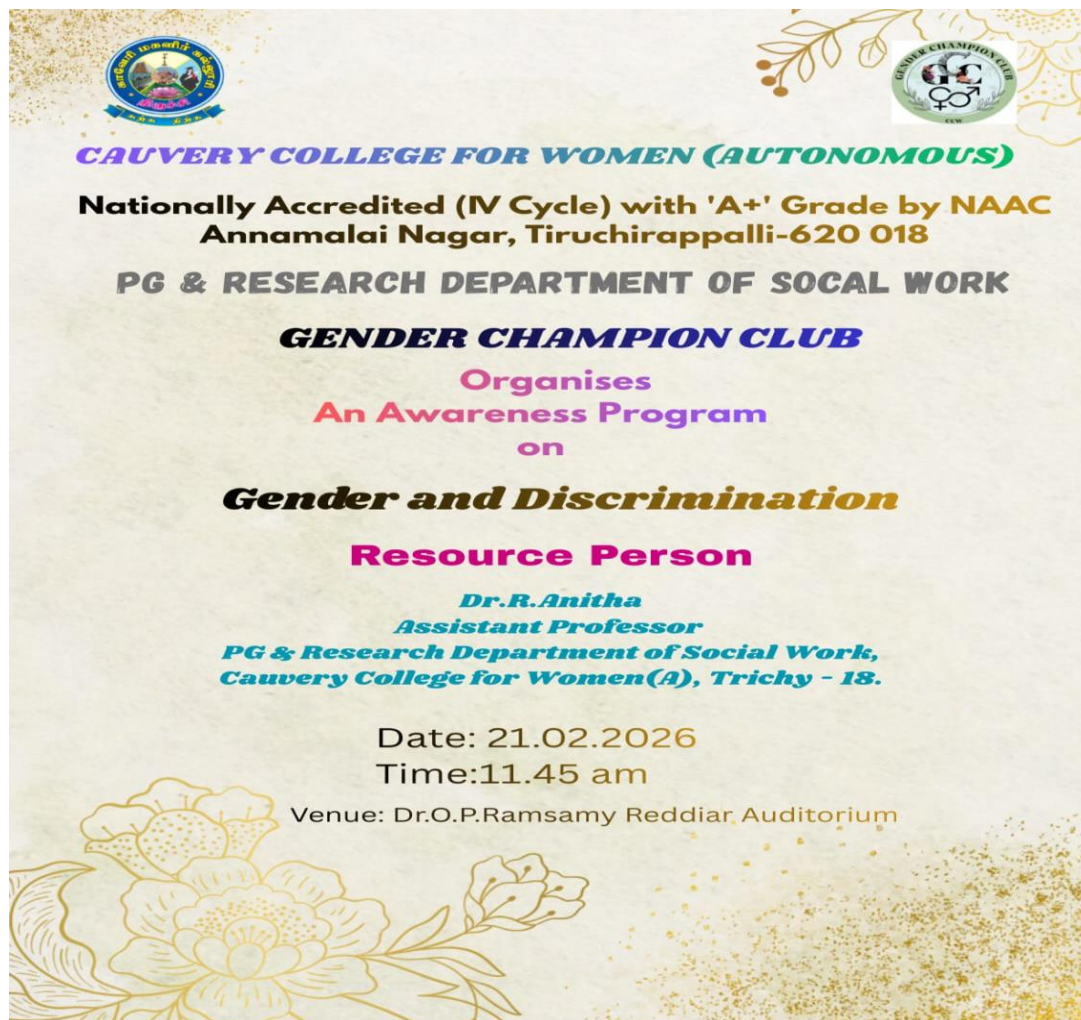

The resource person was Dr. R.Anitha, Assistant Professor, Department of Social work, Cauvery College for Women (A) and Former District Child Protection Officer, Tiruchirappalli and Pudukottai. She explained about Gender discrimination refers to the unequal treatment of individuals based on their gender. It occurs when people are denied rights, opportunities and resources simply because they are male or female. In many societies, gender discrimination is rooted in patriarchal values where men are given more power and status than women. This results in unequal access to education, employment, healthcare and decision-making opportunities for women. Discrimination begins early in life. Girl children may receive less nutrition, education and care compared to boys. Practices such as early marriage and preference for male children further reinforce inequality. Around 64 IIIrd UG students from various departments have participated and benefited through this programme .

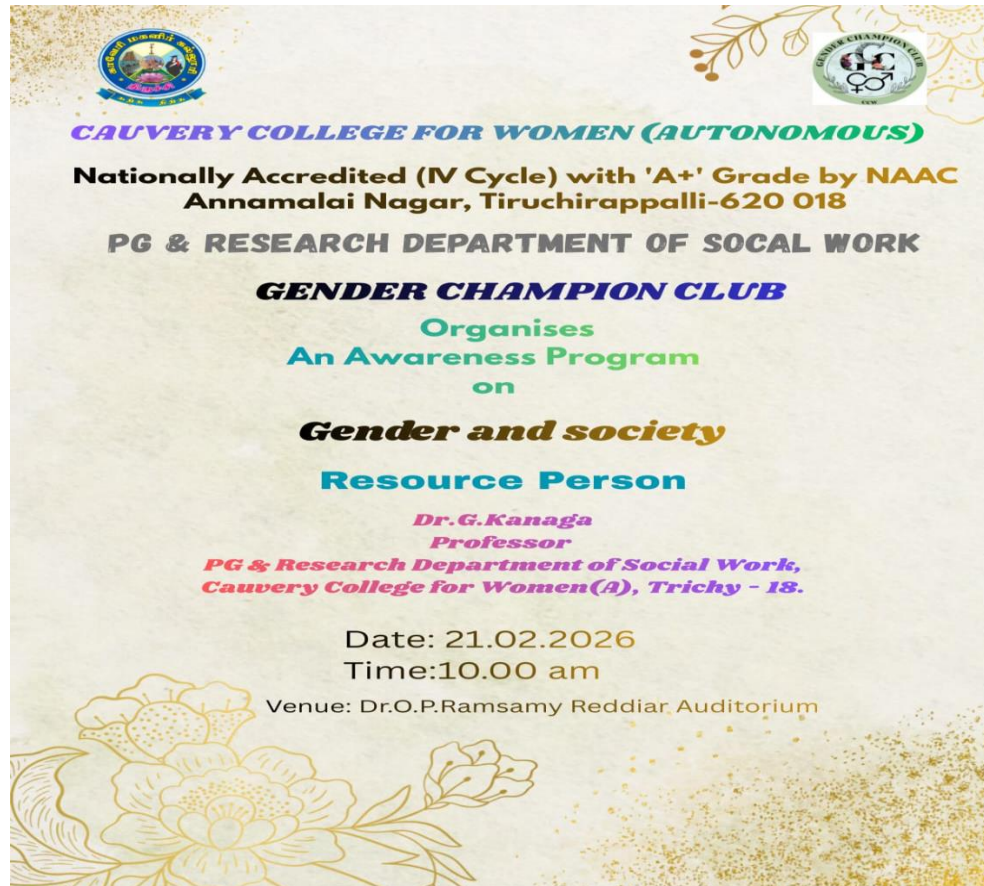

The resource person was Dr. G. Kanaga, Professor, Department of Social work, Cauvery College for Women (A). She explained Gender is shaped by social, cultural, economic and political factors. Society plays a major role in defining gender roles through the process of socialization. From childhood, individuals learn what is considered appropriate behaviour for males and females through family, education, media, religion and peer groups. Most societies are patriarchal in nature, where men dominate positions of power and authority. This results in gender inequality in various spheres such as education, employment, political participation and decision-making. Women often face discrimination in the form of unequal wages, limited access to resources, domestic violence and restricted mobility. Around 64 students of IIIrd UG from various departments have participated.

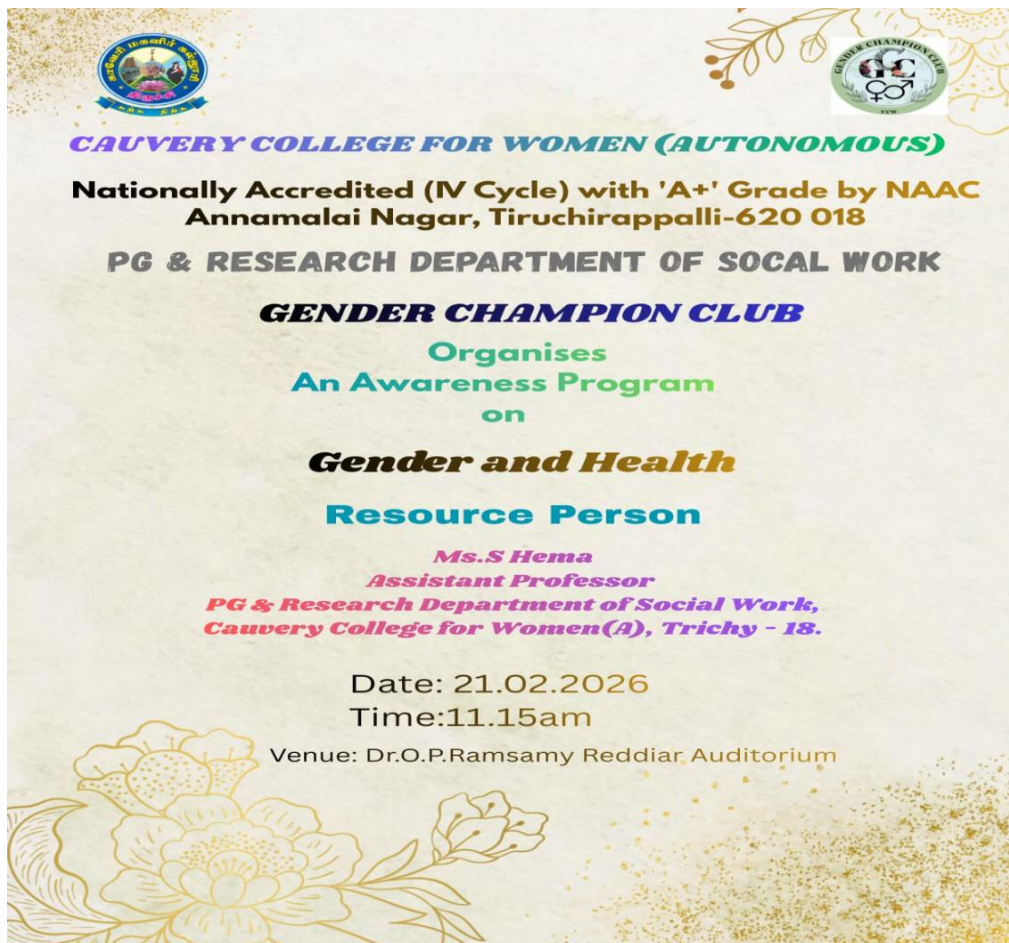

The resource person was Ms.S.Hema, Assistant Professor, Department of Social work, Cauvery College for Women (A). She explained about Gender plays a significant role in occupational health as men and women experience different types of work, risks and health outcomes due to socially defined roles and responsibilities. Women are often concentrated in informal, low-paid and labour-intensive jobs such as domestic work, agriculture, textile work and caregiving. These jobs usually lack safety measures, maternity benefits and health protection. Women are also exposed to occupational hazards like repetitive strain, chemical exposure, poor sanitation and long working hours. Around 69 students IIIrd UG from various departments have participated.
